Jobs grew by 226,078 over the last 5 years and are projected to grow by 220,201 over the next 5 years.

Regional average earnings per job are \$5.5K below the national average earnings of \$80.8K per job.

Takeaways

- As of 2022 the region's population increased by 18.1% since 2017, growing by 513,975. Population is expected to increase by 16.5% between 2022 and 2027, adding 555,974.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs increased by 20.8% in Workforce Solutions N Central TX from 1,088,011 to 1,314,090. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 3.8% by 17.0%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 67.2% to 67.9% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **27.2% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (6.4% above the national average), and **8.0% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.9% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Computer Systems Design and Related Services.




Apr 2023 Labor Force Breakdown



Educational Attainment






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends






Retiring Soon














Top Industry Employment Concentration








Top Industry GRP






Top Occupation Employment Concentration


Educational Pipeline
